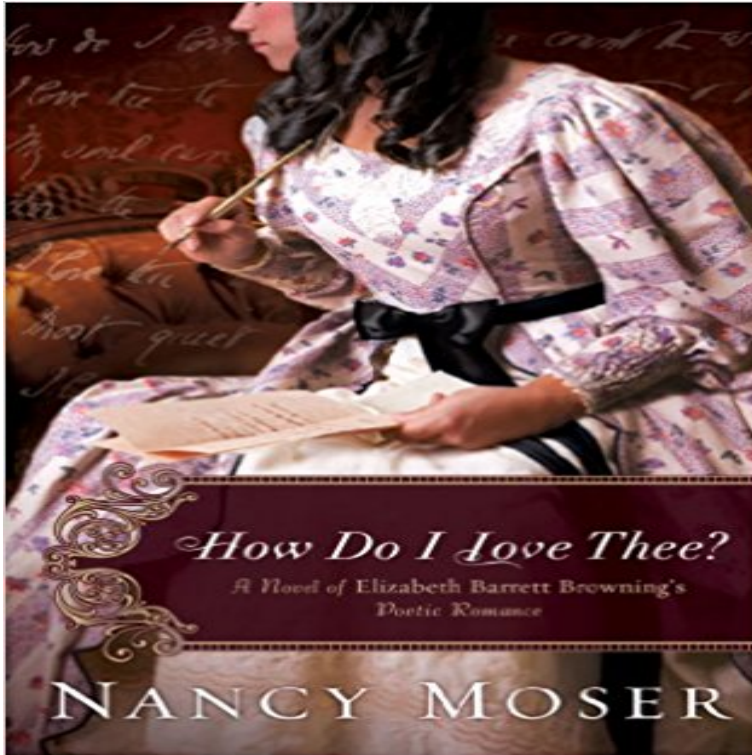


How Do I Love Thee?
