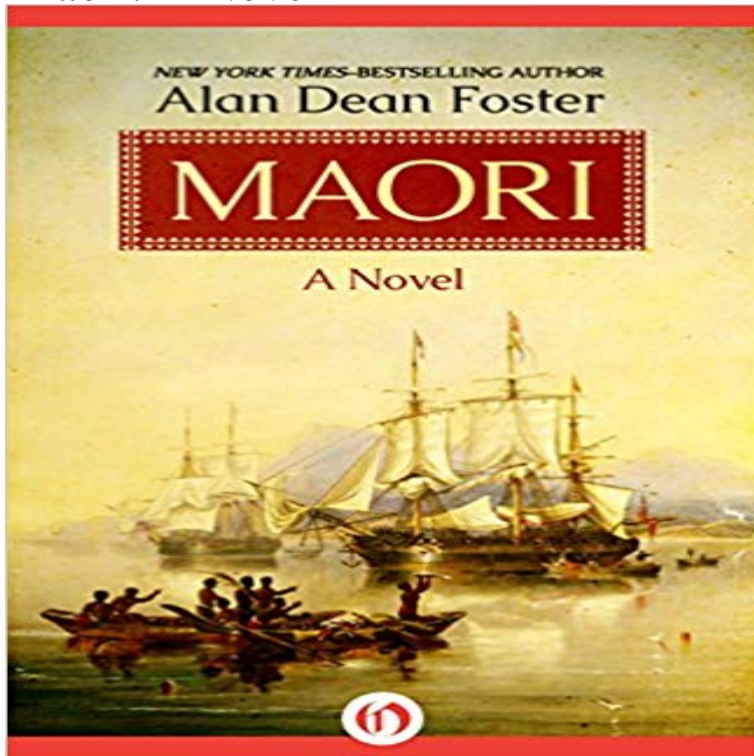


Maori: A Novel
