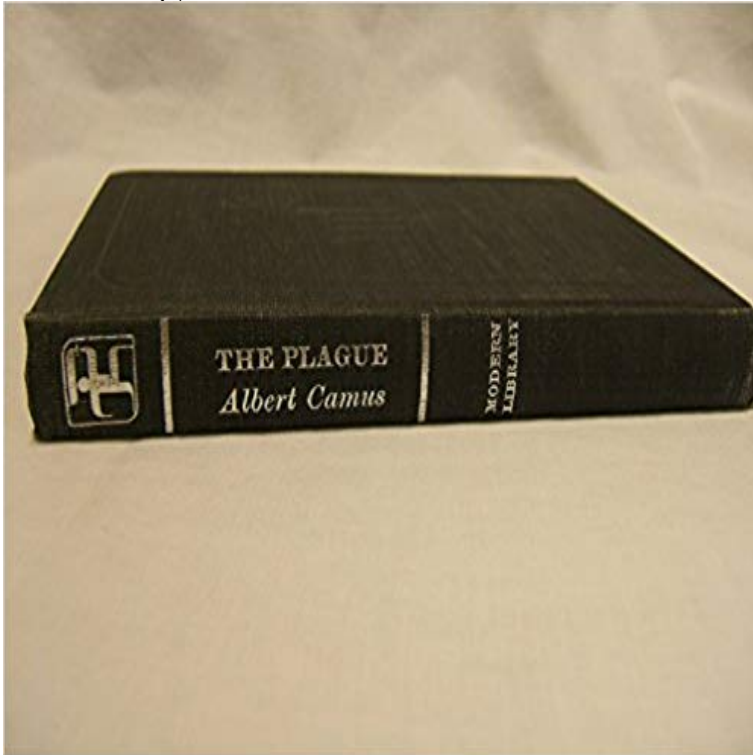


The Plague
