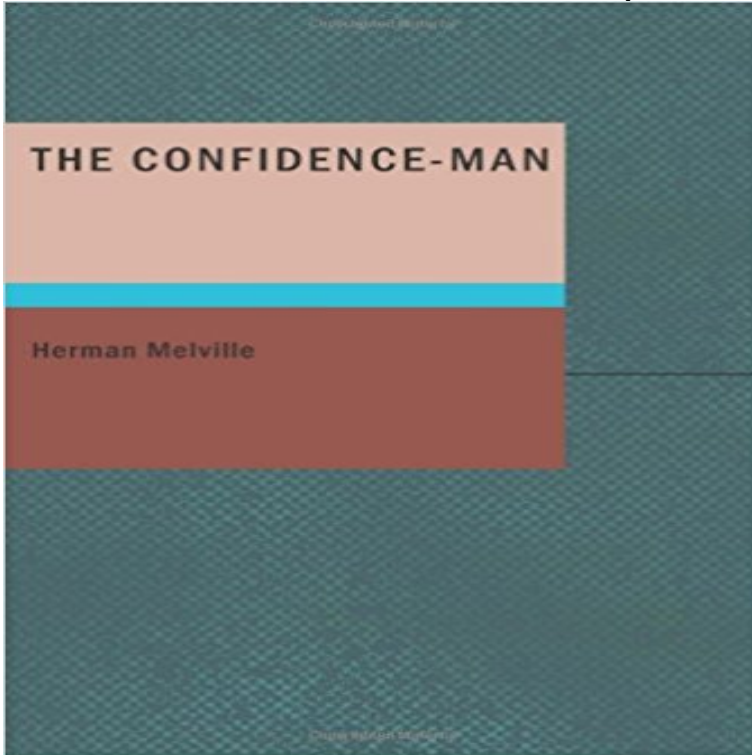


The Confidence-Man: His Masquerade
