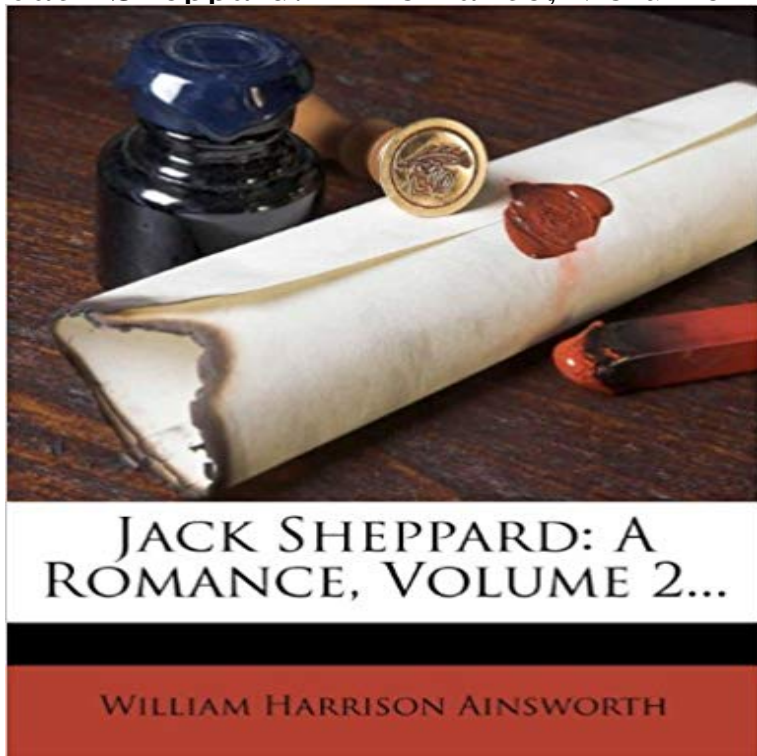


Jack Sheppard: A Romance, Volume 2...
