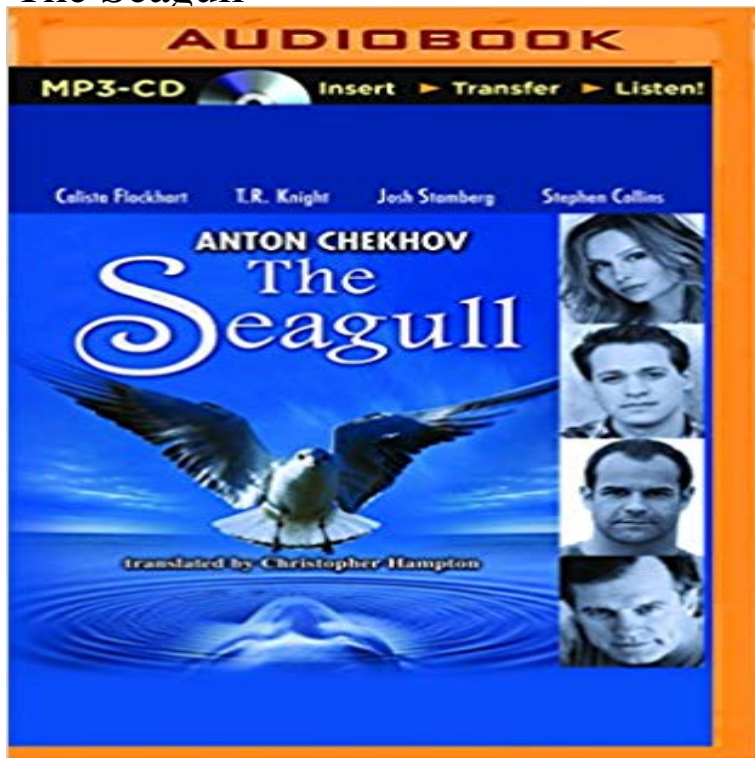


## The Seagull
