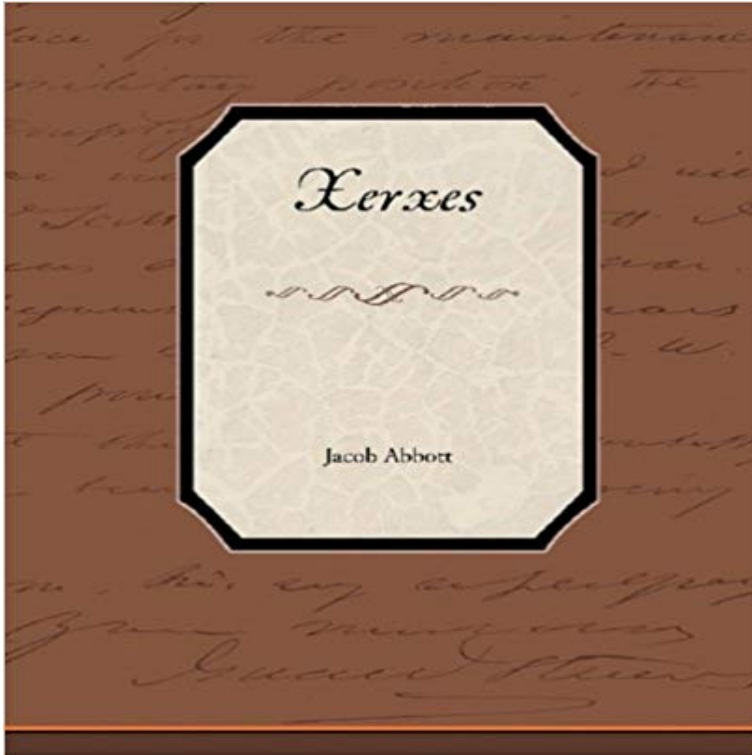


# Xerxes
